

Dear Parents/Guardians:

We are pleased to announce that Crispus Attucks Charter School is eligible for a new option available to select schools in Pennsylvania that participate in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs. It is called the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) and will begin in school year 2014-15.

What does CEP mean for my student(s) who attend Crispus Attucks Charter School? In a CEP school, <u>all</u> students receive a nutritious breakfast and lunch at no cost, regardless of family income. Completion of the annual Free and Reduced Price Meals Family application will not be required this school year.

What if my child changes schools? Your child is eligible for free meals at the school where he/she is currently enrolled. If he/she eats meals at or transfers to a **non-CEP** school during the 2015-16 school year, you may be responsible for meal charges, and may have to complete a Free and Reduced Price Meals Family Application, for that school.

As a CEP school, and a participant in the School Nutrition Program, we are committed to compliance and responsibilities of the Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, Age Discrimination Act of 1975, and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.
